

-STATIONS OF THE CROSS - Friday's of Lent 6:00 pm -ST JOHN KC FISH - March 22nd 4:00 pm—7:00 pm CHECK LIST FOR THE REST OF LENT AND EASTER

- 1. Praying the Morning Offering each morning.
- 2. Praying the Rosary (5 decades) daily.
- 3. Praying the Prayer for Neglects each night.
- 4. Been to STATIONS OF THE CROSS at least once during Lent.
- 5. Have gone to Confession this Lent before Easter.
- 6. Pray the Divine Mercy Novena (begins on Good Friday).
- 7. Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy daily during the Novena.

FAST AND ABSTIENCE REMINDERS

- Good Friday is an obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics.
- Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

—The norms on fasting are obligatory for all from age 18 until age 59. Fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon all Catholics from age 14 onwards.

CHRISM MASS

The Chrism Mass will be in Owensboro at the Sportscenter with Bishop Medley on Tuesday, March 26th at 6:30 pm. If anyone would like to attend as St. John's 2 representatives please call the office by Friday, March 22nd. There will be 2 seats reserved for you on the floor. You will get the Holy Oils from Bishop Medley at the end of Mass when our parish name is called out.

HOLY WEEK LITURGICAL MINISTERS

<u>NEEDED</u>: Sign-up sheets for Holy Week have been on the table in entrance of the church for at least two weekends. Thanks to all who have signed-up so far, but there are still empty spots that still need to be filled in by folks.

*If you plan to be here at St. John's during the Holy Triduum, please prayerfully consider signing at least one of the spots that are still available.

*As a FYI...those who sign up for the Foot Washing on Holy Thursday evening will not have to worry about being in the sanctuary and climbing the steps. Those who sign up for the Foot Washing ceremony will sit at the end of the pew in the center aisle. Father will come among the people and wash your foot as you sit in your pew. Let us all pray for a grace-filled Holy Week.

RELIGIOUS QUESTIONS OFTEN ASKED

What do you do with your blessed palms? The way to properly dispose of the old blessed palms would be to either burn them or bury them, but never discard them with the trash.

I want to get new blessed Easter Holy Water on Holy Saturday night or Easter Sunday or during the Easter Season, what can I do with leftover holy water in my holy water bottle? As a sacramental that can't be burned like some of the others.

*Holy water should be poured into a small hole in the ground where people do not regularly walk over to return it to the earth. It should not be poured in a sink or toilet or over the grass or bushes.

How am I to dispose of blessed old religious articles that are broken or not longer used? The basic rule for the disposition of these items is to burn or to bury them. The normal "rule of thumb" is that anything that has been blessed should be burned (and then the ashes buried) or simply buried.

It is not a sin to throw away blessed items, but out of proper respect, one should dispose of them in this way. If devotionals have not been blessed, such as some of the holy cards and such that come through the mail, those are simply pictures and can be thrown away.
